


Check out our new site!

Participate in our annual Live Local campaign by supporting local businesses and organizations. Collect stamps, earn prizes and give back to our community! Here's out how it works:

- 1) Pick up a free Live Local passport at City Hall, the Fallon Chamber or the Fallon Convention Center.
- 2) Earn stamps by participating in or buying from local programs or businesses. For example, every time you order a meal at a local restaurant, book a hotel room, get your car serviced or attend games, Live Local awards you for your commerce.
- **3)** Collect and submit at least 22 stamps each month in the following categories: 10 Shop, 5 Eat, 5 Play, 1 Volunteer, 1 Community. Tear off the perforated, postage-paid portion of your passport and drop it in the mail.
